## **CHOOSING SUBJECTS FOR YEAR 9**

Religion, English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities and Health and Physical Education comprise the six compulsory areas of study for students in Year 9.

Therefore, our students will complete mandatory subjects and then have the opportunity to select elective subjects.

Students entering Year 9 will select 3 full year elective subjects they wish to study during the next year.

It is a matter for the College to determine when or if particular subjects will be studied as the student's allocation depends on staffing and resources.

Our Lady of the Southern Cross College has implemented the Australian Curriculum Version 9.0. Detailed information on the Australian Curriculum can be accessed on the ACARA website: <a href="https://v9.australiancurriculum.edu.au/">https://v9.australiancurriculum.edu.au/</a>.

It is important to choose your subjects carefully as your decisions may affect your future success at College.

As an overall plan, we suggest you choose elective subjects:

- which match your thoughts about possible career and employment goals
- which reflect your interests and abilities
- in which you have previously received good results
- that you enjoy spending time engaging in outside of class time
- which develop the skills, knowledge and attitudes that will be useful in your life
- which allow you to ensure a balance with school and outside commitments

It is important to remember that students are individuals and that their needs and requirements in subject selection will be quite different from those of other students.

This means that it is unwise to either take or avoid a subject because:

- someone told them they will like or dislike it
- their friends are or are not taking it
- they like or dislike the teacher

Subject selection will be completed online with the link being available directly to students via email. An email will be sent to each student's school email addresses from noreply@selectmysubjects.com.au with the subject line of "Your Web Preferences Access Guide". Students will be required to enter their parents email address so that parents can sign electronically to acknowledge that subject choices have been made collaboratively with student and parent. Acknowledging these elective choices is an important step in our subject selection process. We strongly recommend that both students and parents/guardians add noreply@selectmysubjects.com.au as a Contact in the email application. This will reduce the likelihood of the email landing in their Spam/Junk folder.



## **Elective Subjects**

Elective subjects in Year 9 comprise a variety of ACARA curriculum areas. This handbook has been produced to help students plan a Course of Study which will provide a balanced education across Key Learning Areas and provide greater opportunity for success.

The Our Lady of the Southern Cross College Curriculum consists of a set of year long subjects from which students can choose according to their own needs and abilities.

Students entering Year 9 will nominate 3 elective units they wish to study during the next year.

PLEASE NOTE: An elective's viability to be included will also depend on the availability of staff, resources and student interest.

## **Design Technology - Materials**

There is nothing more rewarding than making your own item from scratch. Join our INTAD team and experience producing some interesting creations. Industrial Technology allows students to develop production techniques through the use of different materials and technologies. Technology in its broadest sense incorporates equipment from a simple handsaw through to 3D printers and design being controlled from a drawing you have created on your laptop. Students will be given opportunity to focus on production skills and less on design although students will be required to evaluate products they produce with consideration of the aesthetics and functionality. Enjoy the pleasure of making useful items in a range of materials from timber, sheet metal and plastic and at the completion of the course you will have exciting new products and skills to take home.

## **Digital Technologies**

Learning in Digital Technologies focusses on further developing understanding and skills in computational thinking such as precisely and accurately describing problems and the use of modular approaches to solutions. It also focusses on engaging students with specialised learning in preparation for vocational training or learning in the senior secondary years. In Year 9, students consider how human interaction with Artificial Intelligence, networked systems introduce complexities surrounding access to, and the security and privacy of, data of various types. They interrogate security practices and techniques used to compress data, and

learn about the importance of separating content, presentation and behavioural

web design and coding using varied

security through local investigations in	
Dalby and global comparisons, while	
developing core geographical inquiry skills.	
Students learn to question, research, and	
analyse data using real-world case studies	
like Toowoomba. They then examine	
environmental change and management,	
focusing on First Nations Australians'	
custodial responsibilities and environmental	
worldviews. Field experiences at Girraween	
National Park and the Sunshine Coast allow	

students to compare country and coastal



towns, culminating in a rich exploration of human wellbeing and interconnections	
across diverse landscapes.

Theoretical aspects covered in Year 9 include sports psychology and sports nutrition to enhancing performance, healthy and safe choices, tournament organisation and game promotion, through being a coach/leader/mentor. Students will organise and officiate a one day mini volleyball tournament for our Year 5 and 6 students. The aim is to provide students with the tools to be successful at any level, from lifelong learners to elite athletes.

## Visual Art

In Year 9 Visual Art, you will explore the world of art-making. Art is all around us from the graphics we see on screen to the patterning on our clothes.

Across the year, you will:

- Create artworks in both 2D and 3D drawing, painting, sculpture, and digital art
- Learn practical skills to bring your ideas to life, from composition to refining your technical skills
- Respond to client-style briefs, generating ideas and exploring how artists work in realworld contexts
- Analyse and evaluate other artist's work
- Curate and present your artwork for gallery and online audiences

You'll experiment with materials, explore symbolism and storytelling, and reflect on how your art connects with others. It's handson, expressive, and full of opportunities to build confidence and creative thinking. Visual Art builds skills for future pathways in fine arts illustration graphic design, concept

fine arts, illustration, graphic design, concept arts, animation and more.
